How to Worship Jesus as Your King John 12:1-11 April 5, 2020

- 1. Witness like Lazarus (1, 2, 11).
  - a. Lazarus was a very close friend of Jesus (11:1-5).
  - b. When Lazarus passed away, Jesus wept over him (11:35).
  - c. Lazarus became a public enemy when he was raised from the dead (12:9-11).
  - d. Lazaras was risking his life to open his home to Jesus (11:57).
  - e. By identifying with Jesus, Lazarus was testifying of his faith in Jesus as His Lord resulting in many Jews believing on Jesus.
- 2. Serve like Martha (2).
  - a. Martha was known to be distracted by serving (Luke 10:38-42).
  - b. Martha was a believer in Jesus as the Messiah (John 11:20-27).
  - c. Martha was now serving Jesus as an act of worship.
- 3. Worship like Mary (3-8).
  - a. Mary's worship was extravagant (3).
    - i. Her gift was very costly (3).
      - 1. Spikenard was imported from India.
      - 2. Spikenard was used to perfume the bodies of the dead.
    - ii. Her gift cost 300 pence, and a working man's annual salary (5).
    - iii. She was willing to worship Jesus at any cost.
  - b. Mary's worship was humble (3).
    - i. By washing Jesus' feet, Mary was choosing to take the place of a lowly servant.
    - ii. By wiping Jesus' feet with her hair, Mary was displaying extreme humility.
    - iii. She was willing to worship Jesus without reservation.
  - c. Mary's worship was an expression of faith (7-8).
    - i. Believing that Jesus was going to die, she chose to anoint Jesus while He was still living!
    - ii. We would do well to worship the Lord while we still have the chance!
    - iii. She worshipped Jesus with more complete faith than any other disciple of Christ to this point!
  - d. Mary's faith was in stark contrast to the unbelief of the nation (12ff).
    - i. The Pharisees saw Jesus as a threat to their safety (19; cf. 11:47-48, 53).
    - ii. The Jewish people saw Jesus as merely a political ruler and not the eternal Son of God (34-37).
    - iii. Many who did believe on Jesus were afraid to tell others for fear of religious persecution (42-43).

## Conclusion:

- 1. The first act of worship is believing on Jesus (46).
- 2. Once you've trusted Jesus as your Savior, you can begin to worship Him extravagantly. What does that look like for you?
- 3. As you worship like Mary, God would have you serve others as He served us. In what way can you begin to serve those around you?
- 4. As you serve those around you, you have a great opportunity to tell others what Jesus has done for you. What are you doing to share your testimony with others?
