

## Becoming a Person that God Can Use

1 Samuel 16-17

December 10, 2023

### 1. David's Background (16:1-13)

- a. David was born in Bethlehem (16:1-5).
  - i. Bethlehem was where Ruth married Boaz and gave birth to Obed, David's grandfather.
  - ii. Bethlehem was a small, seemingly insignificant town (Micah 5:2).
- b. David was the eighth and youngest son in his family (16:6-10).
  - i. When Samuel invited Jesse and his family to the sacrifice, Jesse left David home to tend the sheep.
  - ii. God saw something in David that no one else could see (6-10).
- c. David was chosen by God (16:12-13).
  - i. David was not chosen because he was handsome; he was chosen because he was a man after God's own heart (1 Samuel 13:14; Psalm 34:18-22).
  - ii. David's work as a shepherd became a proving ground for his development as a man of God and a leader.

### 2. David's Preparation

- a. David's preparation met opportunity (16:14-23).
  - i. He was cunning in playing the harp (18).
  - ii. He was a mighty valiant man (18).
  - iii. He was a man of war (18).
  - iv. He was prudent in matters (18).
  - v. He was a handsome young man (18).
  - vi. The Lord was with him (18).
  - vii. He exceeded expectations (21-22).
  - viii. He refreshed Saul's spirit (23).
- b. David's preparation created an opportunity (17:12-37).
  - i. David is still too young to fight, and he returns to keep his father's sheep (17:12-15).
  - ii. David brings his brothers food on the front lines and witnesses Goliath's defiance (17:16-25).
  - iii. David responds with a zeal for God's glory and for the nation of Israel (17:26-30).
  - iv. David knew that God would deliver him from Goliath just as He delivered him from a lion and a bear (17:31-37).

### 3. David's Triumph

- a. David chose weapons he had already mastered (38-40).
- b. David engaged the enemy (40).
- c. David fought for the glory of God rather than his own glory (41-47).
- d. David charged toward Goliath and killed him just as he said he would (42-51).
- e. David's victory prepared the way for Israel's victory (52-53).
- f. David's victory prepared the way for future victory (54-58).
  - i. David kept Goliath's head as a trophy and brought it with him later to Jerusalem (2 Kings 5:1-10).
  - ii. David consecrated Goliath's sword to God which would later become the sword he carried when running from Saul (1 Samuel 21:9).
